

It is an intensive and in-depth practical course.

This qualification is aimed at those learners who hold a recognised Level 2 or equivalent hairdressing qualification and /or ideally, work in a salon.

This qualification is most suitable for those learners who wish to become a senior stylist. The qualification builds on existing knowledge and understanding of hairdressing and develops more creative and advanced technical skills necessary for employment.

Learners who achieve this qualification are able to work as a senior stylist and could work in a variety of different sectors, which might include:

- Commercial salons
- Independent/self-employed/mobile/home-based salon settings
- Product manufacturing
- Training/teaching within private centres/colleges
- Cruise liners
- Television, film, theatre and media



Classes (Maximum 6 students) are taught through practical demonstrations, distance learning, digital platform and one-to-one attention on each student's work. Students work on each other, Mannequins and models with a very practical and hands-on approach from day one. The focus is: to develop students' practical skills and work responsibility.

At the end of the course you will gain an ITEC International Level 3 Diploma recognised in 33 countries.

3. About this qualification

3.1 Purpose

The VTCT (ITEC) Level 3 Diploma in Hairdressing is a higher level qualification that provides the learner with the knowledge, understanding and skills to work creatively as an employed and/or self-employed hairdresser. This qualification is aimed at those learners who hold a recognised Level 2 or equivalent hairdressing qualification and ideally work in a salon.

Learners must achieve all four mandatory units for this qualification which, include:

- Provide client consultation services
- Creatively cut hair using a combination of techniques
- Creatively colour and lighten hair
- Creatively style and dress hair

This qualification offers a wider range of optional units of which one must be achieved, these include:

- Provide hair colour correction services
- Provide a variety of relaxing services
- Provide specialist hair and scalp treatments
- Provide creative hair extension services
- Create a variety of permed effects

This qualification is most suitable for those learners who wish to become a senior stylist. The qualification builds on existing knowledge and understanding of hairdressing and develops more creative and advanced technical skills necessary for employment. It rewards learner's individual abilities both in practical and theory with a graded outcome of Fail/Pass/Merit/Distinction.

3.3 Progression

Learners who achieve this qualification are able to work as a senior stylist, learners could work in a variety of different sectors, which might include:

- Commercial salons
- Senior stylist/manager
- Independent/self-employed/mobile/home-based salon settings
- Product manufacturing
- Training/teaching within private centres/colleges
- Cruise liners

Whilst this qualification's primary purpose is to prepare the learner for employment as a senior stylist they may choose to complement their skills base or become a specialist in a particular field of hairdressing by undertaking a Level 4 Certificate in Trichology for Hairdressers.

To note: Within the United Kingdom, when this qualification is completed, learners are eligible to become a State Registered Hairdresser (SRH) with The Hairdressing Council.

4. Qualification structure

To be awarded the VTCT (ITEC) Level 3 Diploma in Hairdressing learners must achieve:

- all mandatory units
- a minimum of one optional unit
- the theory examinations
- the synoptic practical examination

The minimum TQT required to achieve this qualification is 547.

Grades achieved in each external examination are awarded points that contribute to the overall qualification grade.

Examinations must be undertaken by learners under controlled examination conditions in accordance with VTCT's policies and procedures for external assessment.

6.4 Synoptic practical examination

The synoptic practical examination is externally set, externally examined, graded and quality assured by VTCT. Information on how to operate practical examinations can be found the awarding organisations website.

In preparation for the external synoptic practical examination, centres are advised to ensure learners have completed their service portfolios and conducted an internal mock practical examination. As part of the service portfolio learners are required to have completed their style collection before the synoptic practical examination is taken. The style collection work must be available for the external examiner to view on the day of the synoptic practical examination.

It is essential centres use the Synoptic Practical Examination Criteria document in order to make assessment judgements when preparing for examinations. This can be found on the awarding organisations website.

The synoptic practical examination preparation must take place in a realistic working environment on a real client and in a commercially acceptable time frame.

6.4.1 Retaking external examinations

Learners who fail to achieve the required Pass mark are permitted to re-sit after having sufficient teaching and additional study time. There is no limit to the number of retakes a learner can carry out.

6.4.2 Reasonable adjustments and special considerations

Information on the reasonable adjustments allowed for the external examinations within this qualification can be found in the policies section on the awarding organisation's website.

6.5 Service portfolio

A service portfolio for each unit is required to be completed under the supervision of a lecturer who must monitor the quality of the services performed throughout the learner's training. The criteria of what must be included in the service portfolio is detailed in the unit specification and the learner logbook which are available to download from the website.

The service portfolio will include a style collection for:

- iUHB310 - Creatively cut hair using a combination of techniques
- iUHB312 - Creatively style and dress hair

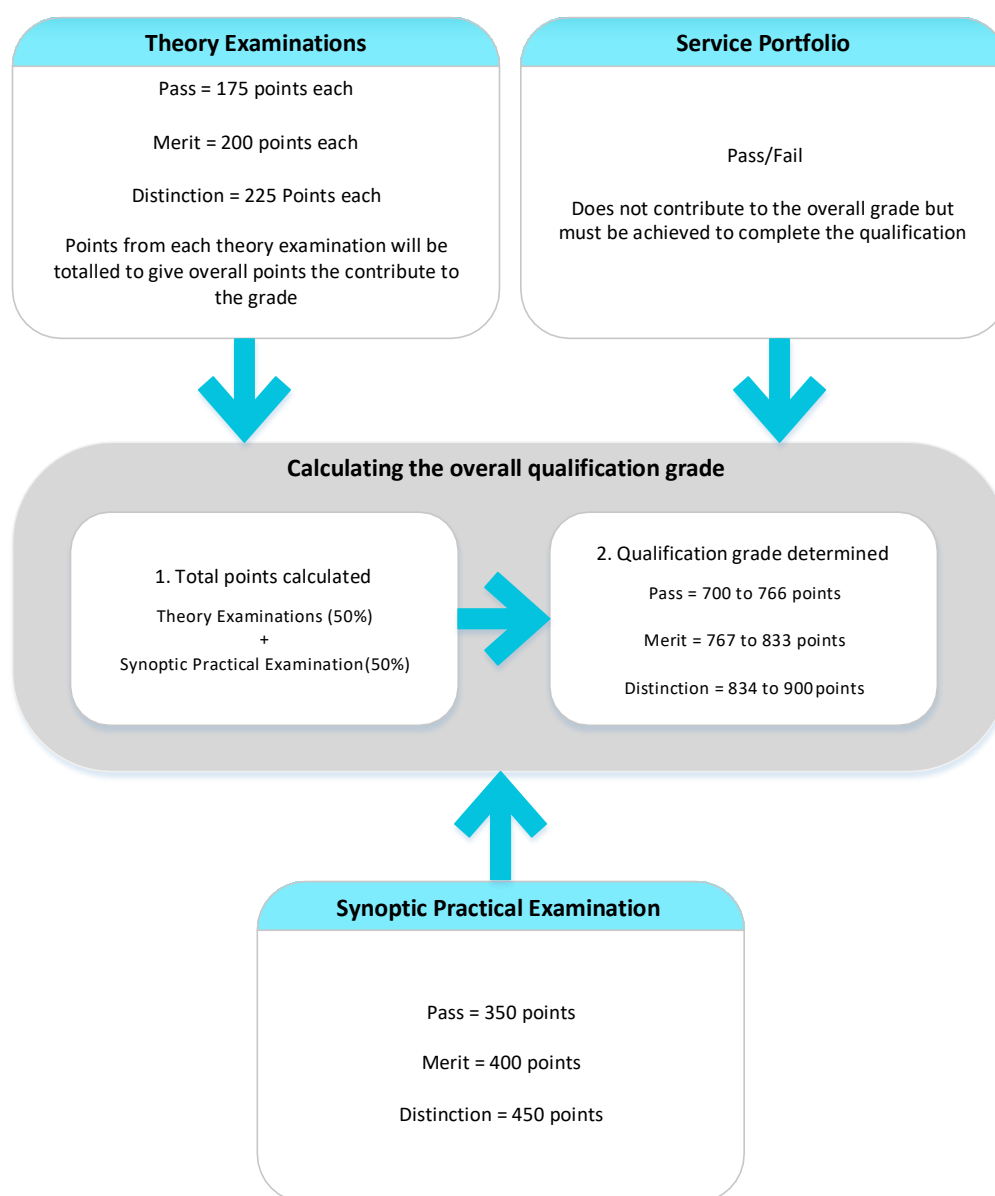
7. Grading

7.1 Overview

This qualification is graded Pass/Merit/Distinction. This is only applicable to the mandatory units. Optional units are graded Pass/Refer and at least one unit must be achieved to be awarded the qualification, however they do not contribute to the overall grade.

There are two separate components in the grading model for this qualification, the graded external examinations and a graded external synoptic practical examination. Each component contributes 50% to the overall qualification grade.

Learners must achieve a Pass grade or higher in the external theory examinations and synoptic practical examination. The grades achieved in each assessment correlate to points. These points will then be added together to determine the overall grade of the qualification, as shown below:



7.2 Grade boundary review

Grade boundaries for units and the overall calculation for the qualification grade are open to annual review. Following this review, these boundaries and overall calculations can be adjusted by VTCT. This review and possible change within a qualification are to ensure the standard of the qualification grade is upheld throughout the qualification's lifecycle.

8. External examiner

8.1 External examiner visits

This qualification is externally examined by the awarding organisation. Centres delivering this qualification will have a quality assurance visit each time an examiner visits the centre.

On a centre visit an examiner:

- examines all learners entered for the external practical examination
- samples learners' service portfolio
- verifies that appropriate staff and sufficient resources are in place, and that the centre is continuing to meet the criteria specified in the centre contract
- checks that the centre's policies and procedures continue to meet the awarding organisation's requirements
